B4525, Welsh Lane near Greatworth

## Duration

**Weekend road closure:** 8pm Friday 17 April to 6am Monday 20 April 2026.

**Overnight road closures:** 20 April, 21 April and 22 April 2026, 8pm to 6am.

**Weekend road closure:** 8pm Friday 24 April to 6am Monday 27 April 2026.

If we are unable to complete these works due to poor weather or programme delay, we will require a closure on these **contingency dates:** 8pm Friday 8 May to 6am Monday 11 May 2026.

**Traffic lights:** Monday 20 April until Sunday 31 May 2026.

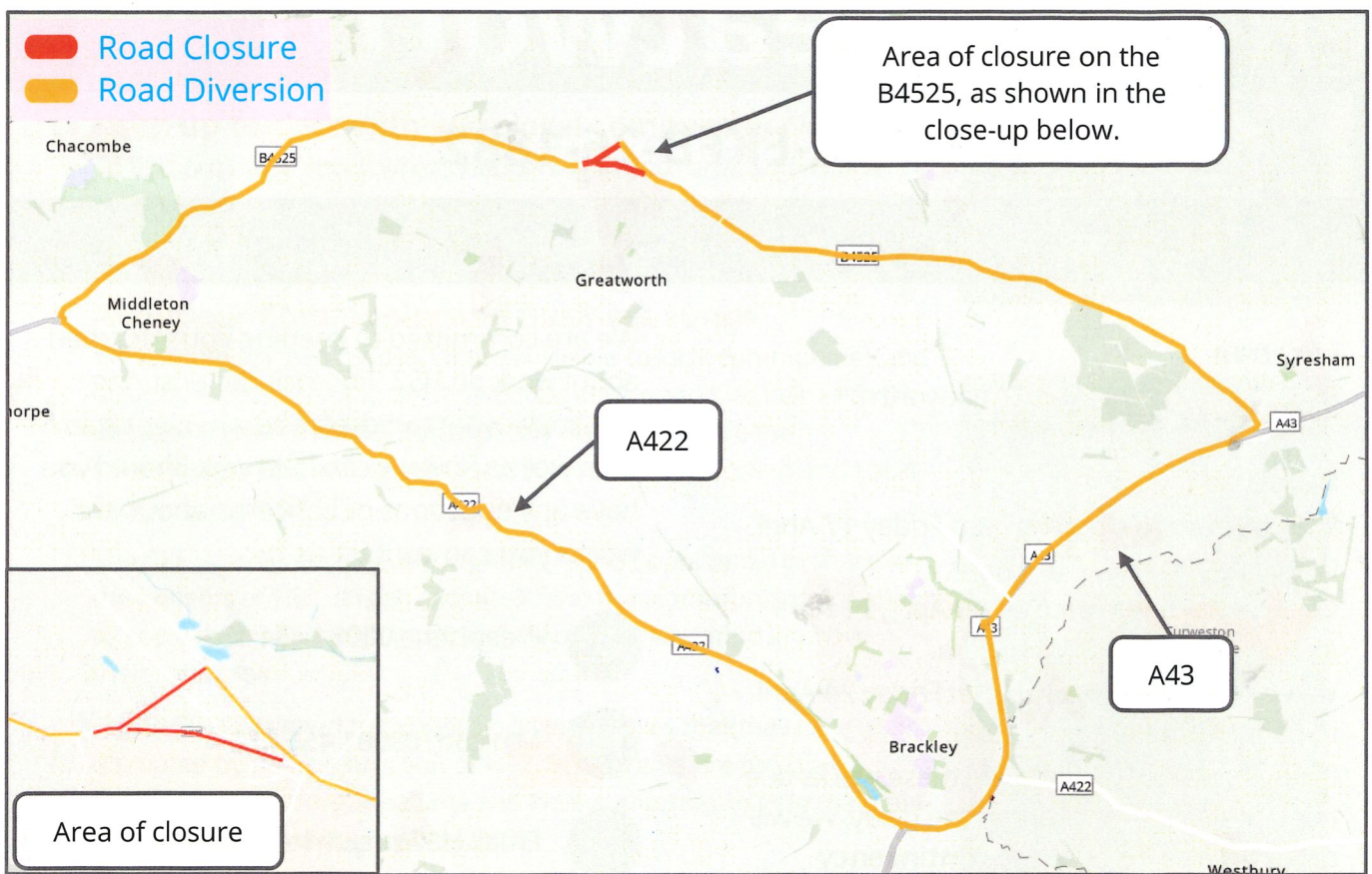

- Workforce and machinery in the public highway.

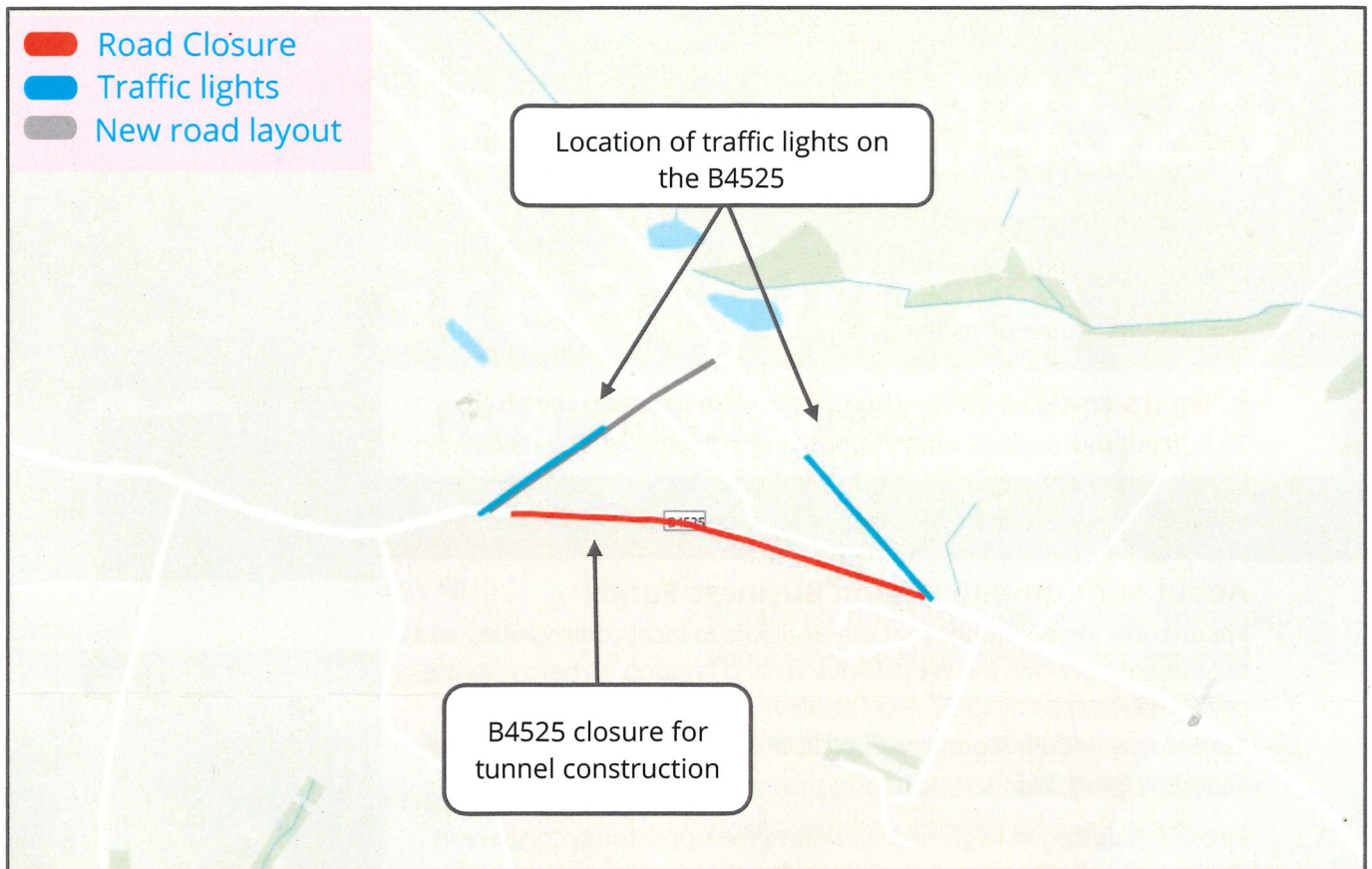
### Weekend and overnight road closures diversion map

A section of the road will be closed between the Greatworth turn and the roundabout on B4525. A diversion will be in place as shown on the map below.

Traffic lights will operate as required at one of the two locations shown on the map below between Monday 20 April until Sunday 31 May 2026. The exact location of the traffic lights will change as the work progresses.
